Mission


My mission is to create this type of learning environment which fosters growth for my students mentally, physically, emotionally, and socially.



ENVIRONMENT PLANS

- Plan 1 Flexible Seating
 - Objective: Through the use of flexible seating, the student will choose the seat which allows him/her to do their best work.
 - Materials: variety of flexible seating options
 - Activity: Explore flexible seating options and appropriate/inappropriate ways to use them.
- Plan 3 Morning Meeting Area
- Objective: The student will be able to discuss his/her opinion about world current events through group discussion after watching CNN 10 in the morning meeting area.
- Materials: Carpet, open space, smart board
- <u>Activity:</u> students will view CNN 10 and discuss their favorite headlines in the morning meeting area

- Plan 2 Classroom Library
 - Objective: Using the classroom library, the student will be able to select and interpret texts of interest which are on grade level independently and proficiently.
 - Materials: Books, book boxes, soft seating
 - Activity: Students will be shown the classroom library and given a chance to fill their book boxes.

OPlan 4 - Cubby Area

- Objective: The student will take part in appropriate cubby area behaviors in the cubby space.
- Materials: Individual cubbies, coat hooks, shelves,
- Activity: Students will practice placing materials (jacket, backpack, etc.) into their own cubby space at open house and on first day of class.
